

DO YOU NEED SPECIAL ASSISTANCE OR REASONABLE ACCOMMODATION?

Do you need help with your application, redetermination, or other program requirements?

If you have a disability, Child Care Resources can help by providing supports or accommodations to make it easier for you to get the services you need. This type of help is called a reasonable accommodation.

What are examples of reasonable accommodations for people with disabilities?

- Making your appointments at times that avoid rush hour travel
- Shortening your wait times at the Child Care Resources Office
- Arranging for a sign language interpreter
- Helping you with reading and completing forms
- Assistance with appealing any action on your case

A few examples of conditions that may cause you to need a reasonable accommodation:

- Vision, speech, or hearing impairments
- Medical conditions like arthritis, cancer, multiple sclerosis, heart disease, cirrhosis, or HIV/AIDS
- Developmental or learning disabilities
- Mental health conditions like bipolar disorder, clinical depression, anxiety disorder, or schizophrenia
- Services for Clients Who Are Deaf or Hard of Hearing

How do I ask for a reasonable accommodation?
